



St. John the Apostle was born in the 1st century. He was the son of Zebedee and Salome, and was one of the first of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus. John was called to be an Apostle by our Lord in the first year of His public ministry. He stood faithfully at the cross when the Savior made him guardian of his mother. When John was banished to the Greek Island of Patmos by the Roman authorities, he wrote the Book of Revelation. He is known to be the author of the Gospel of John and four other books: the three Epistles of John and the book of Revelation. The phrase, "The disciple whom Jesus loved," or "The Beloved Disciple" is used 5 times but not used in any other New Testament books. He is known as the Apostle of Charity, a virtue he learned from his Divine Master. He died in Ephesus after AD 98, where a stately church was erected over this tomb, which was converted into a Mosque.
